- 2006 Monte Antico Tuscano (\$10) Consistently a top value Italian red, it's quaffable, with soft tannins and red fruit.
- · 2006 Félsina Chianti Classico (\$22) Félsina delivers a ripe, drinkable wine with a firm tannic structure and a mixture of red and black fruits.
- 2006 Talenti Rosso di Montalcino (\$30) The name "Talenti" carries weight with connoisseurs. This is a great "baby brunello" that's plush, ripe, and oh so seductive.

• 2008 Babich Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc (\$12) A consistent example of the zesty, citrusy, juicy sauvignon blancs from New Zealand's Marlborough region.

Reserva Rosé Cava (\$23) Rich, complex, and creamy, this Cava bursts with fruit and easily matches a wide range of food.

· 2007 William Fèvre Chablis Montée de Tonnerre (\$35) This premier cru Chablis, from a first-rate house, has notes of mineral and green apple.
